There, she became interested in behavioral health care through the lens of understanding how grief, loss, and trauma impact childhood development. She went on to work as a music therapist and bereavement coordinator in hospice care on both geriatric and pediatric care teams while continuing to focus on improving educational and mental health outcomes for youth and families after loss.

Caitlin has taken her nearly 15 years of experience with direct patient care and translated it into the development and oversight of bereavement programming throughout the country, serving grieving clients around the world as a practitioner,

grief educator, and program administrator. By implementing innovative technologies, approaches, and solutions, she prioritized making mental and emotional support services widely accessible, particularly for those in impoverished and rural areas.

Having a strong desire to disrupt systems of historical oppression and promote generational healing, she pursued her master's degree in social work while working with the National Association of Social Workers, Ohio Chapter (NASW-OH) to promote positive social change for Ohioans. With knowledge ranging from clinical practice to program management and advocacy, Caitlin excels in translating the needs of individuals, families, and communities into responsive policy solutions.
